40 Hour Pre-Licensing Course | Host Group Real Estate Academy

COURSE DESCRIPTION & OVERVIEW

This course is designed to fulfill the 40-hour pre-licensing MA State requirement to sit for the 2-part real estate licensing exam (National + MA State, administered by PSI Testing Services). Students will learn the key concepts and principles of real estate including brokerage, property ownership, contracts, financing, and more.

Your instructors will also provide test-taking strategies, practice exam questions, insight into starting a career in the real estate business, and how to apply for the real estate exam after completing the course.

SALESPERSON CANDIDATE REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Must be 18+ years old.
- 2. Complete 40 hours of pre-licensing salesperson education.
- 3. Obtain a completed Massachusetts Board of Real Estate Educational Certificate form to be completed by a Board approved Real Estate School (Host Group is approved school #1230).
- 4. Obtain 3 personal endorsements from unrelated individuals.
- 5. Submit a completed application packet to PSI Testing Services (including test fee).
- 6. Pass the 2-part real estate licensing exam administered by PSI.
- 7. Pay a licensing fee and obtain your real estate license.

SALESPERSON CANDIDATE REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Learn the requirements for obtaining and maintaining a real estate salesperson license in Massachusetts.
- 2. Understand the difference between a real estate agent and a real estate broker.
- 3. Master the key concepts and principles of real estate practice, both nationally and in MA.
- 4. Understand a real estate agent's role in real estate transactions.
- 5. Prepare for the licensing exam with practice multiple-choice and math questions, and develop skills for successfully passing the exam.



MATERIALS NEEDED

- 1. A laptop, smartphone or other device with stable internet access and a camera feature.
- 2. Dedication, self-motivation, and commitment to meeting all course requirements within the designated timeframe for completion.

REOUIRED TEXTBOOK

"Principles of Real Estate Practice in Massachusetts" by <u>Mettling</u>, <u>Cusic</u> (Author), & <u>Somers</u> is provided in eBook format with the course. A hard copy of the textbook may be purchased separately but is not required.

COURSE DURATION

This course consists of 40 hours of instruction: 22 hours of instructor-led webinar and ~18 hours of online, self-paced video coursework. You have 30 days from the last scheduled webinar to complete the coursework for our Standard program. Upon successful completion of the course, there is a state-mandated 2-year time limit to take and pass both portions of the licensing exam.
